

Information for clients

Taking our cooperation into account, striving to ensure respect for your privacy, and in order to make sure that you know who processes your personal data and in what way, we present to you the following information.

- 1) The Collector of your personal data shall be the Association for Legal Intervention [Stowarzyszenie Interwencji Prawnej, SIP], residing in Warsaw (01-204 Warszawa) at ul. Siedmiogrodzka 5 / 51, e-mail address: biuro@interwencjaprawna.pl;
- 2) The legal basis on which your personal data are processed shall be the Regulation (EU) 2016/679 of the European Parliament and of the Council of 27 April 2016 on the protection of natural persons with regard to the processing of personal data and on the free movement of such data, and repealing Directive 95/46/EC (General Data Protection Regulation) (Official Journal of the European Union L. of 2016 r. Nr 119, str. 1) – hereinafter referred to as GDPR, i.e. we have received your consent to personal data processing and such processing is necessary for providing you with legal assistance and for meeting legal obligations imposed on us such as the obligation to keep records.
- 3) Recipients of your personal data shall be members of SIP management board, properly authorised employees and partners of SIP, and entities to whom we are obliged to transfer your data under commonly applicable provisions of the law, particularly state authorities and local government bodies to whom such data will be disclosed in connection with a grant agreement or services rendered to you;
- 4) Your personal data shall be transferred to an international organisation under an agreement concluded by and between SIP and said international organisation. You may obtain a copy of your data transferred to third party states / international organisations via e-mail;
- 5) We shall process your personal data throughout the entire period during which the relevant agreement is performed and also later, i.e. until the statute of limitations period has expired for possible claims connected with legal assistance provided and with compliance with the obligation to keep records;
- 6) You have the right to access your personal data and to rectify them, erase them, restrict their processing, transfer them, make an objection regarding your personal data, and, as far as data which are provided voluntarily are concerned, to revoke your consent to their processing at any time which shall have no impact on the lawfulness of processing performed before such consent was revoked. You may revoke your consent to personal data processing by means of sending the relevant declaration in writing or in the electronic form to the following e-mail address: biuro@interwencjaprawna.pl;
- 7) You have the right to file a complaint with the President of the Office for the Protection of Personal Data if you believe that the processing of your personal data violates the provisions of GDPR.
